

1988-89 Through 1992-93

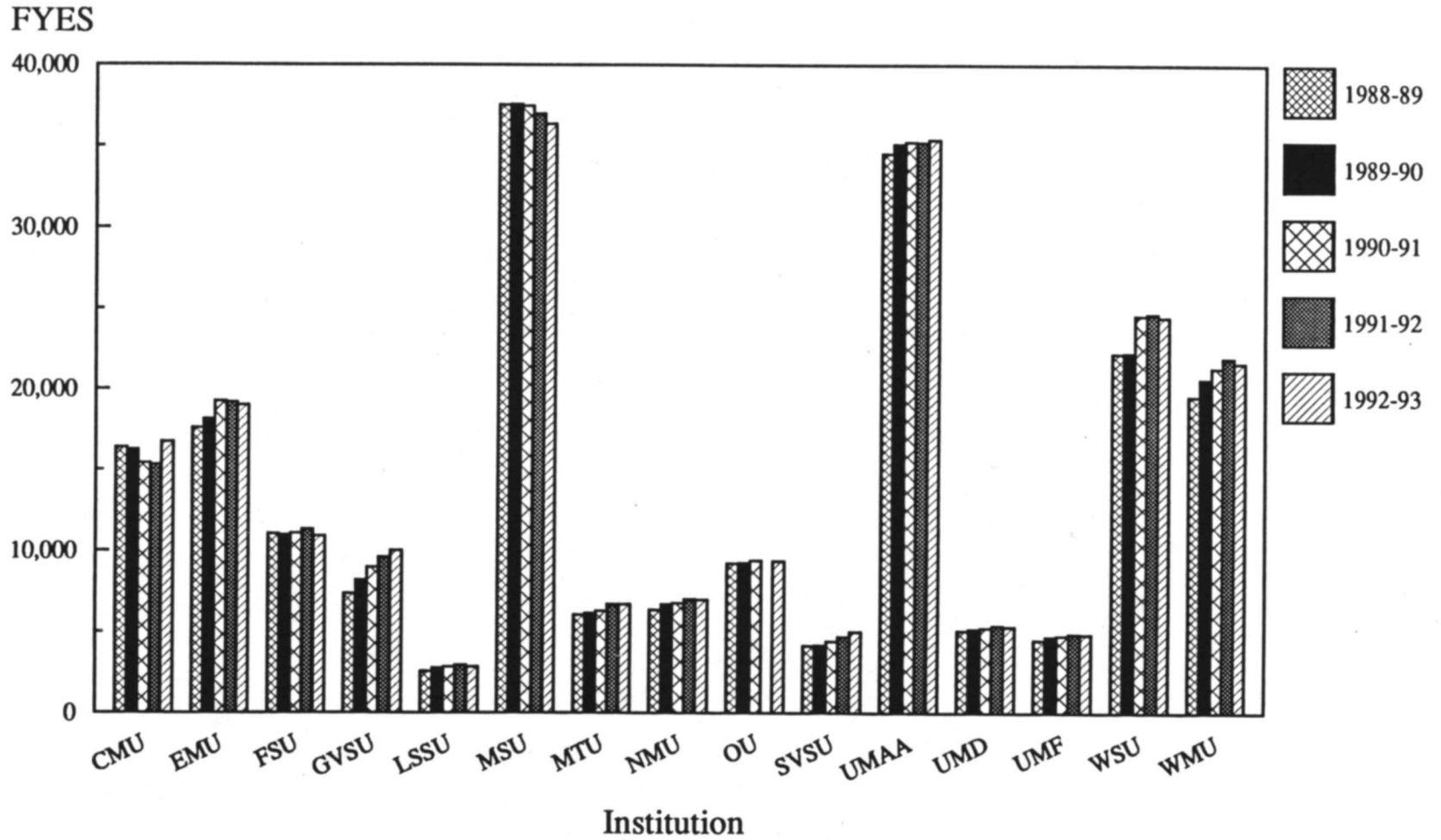

Freshmen Headcount

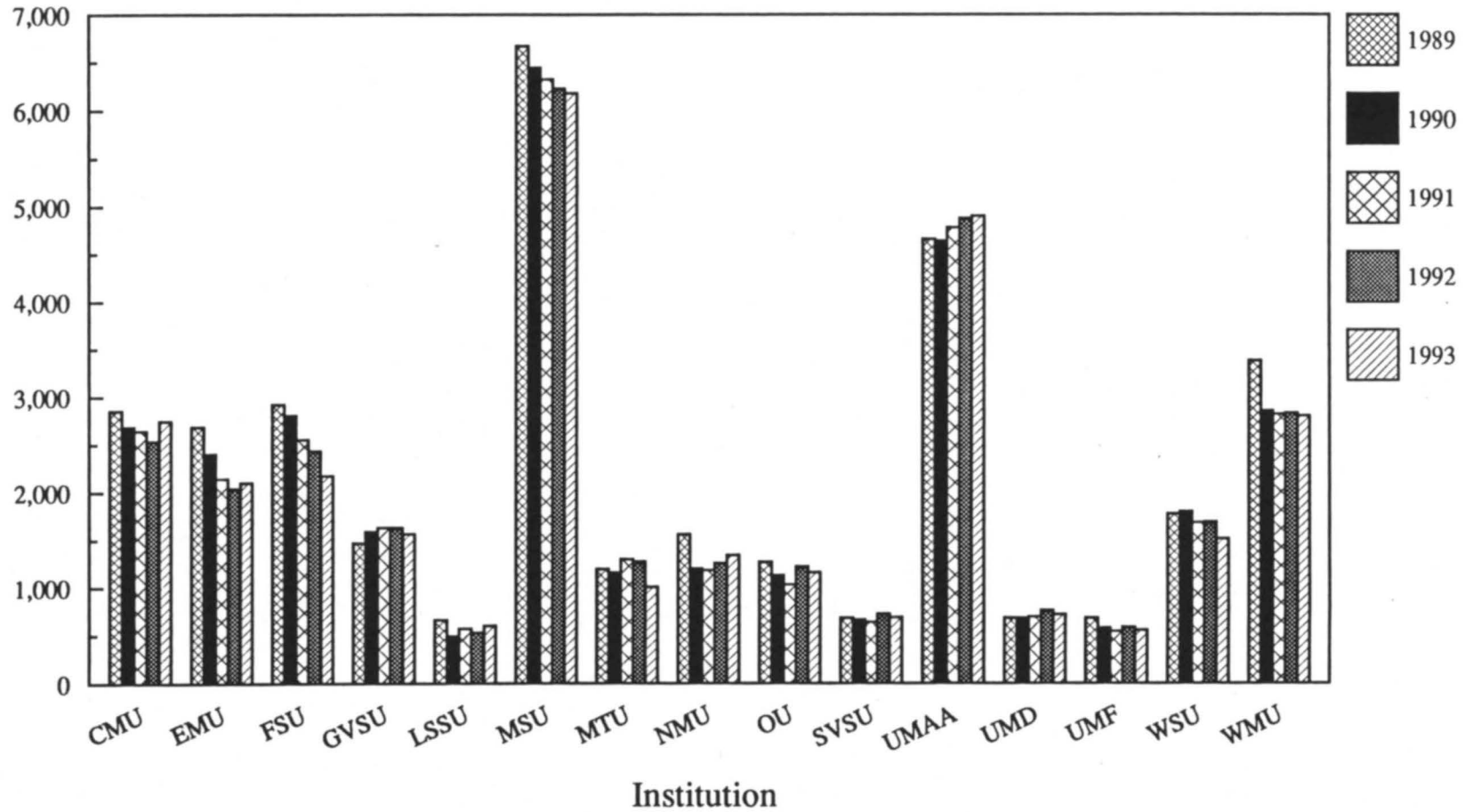

Male 1986-1993

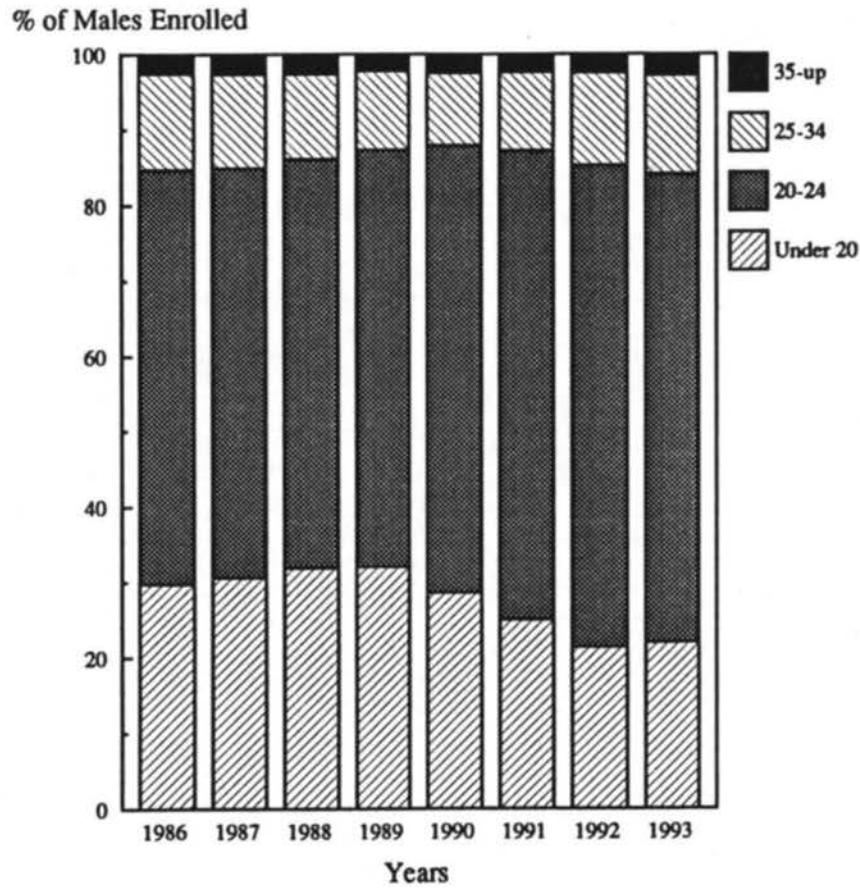

Female 1986-1993

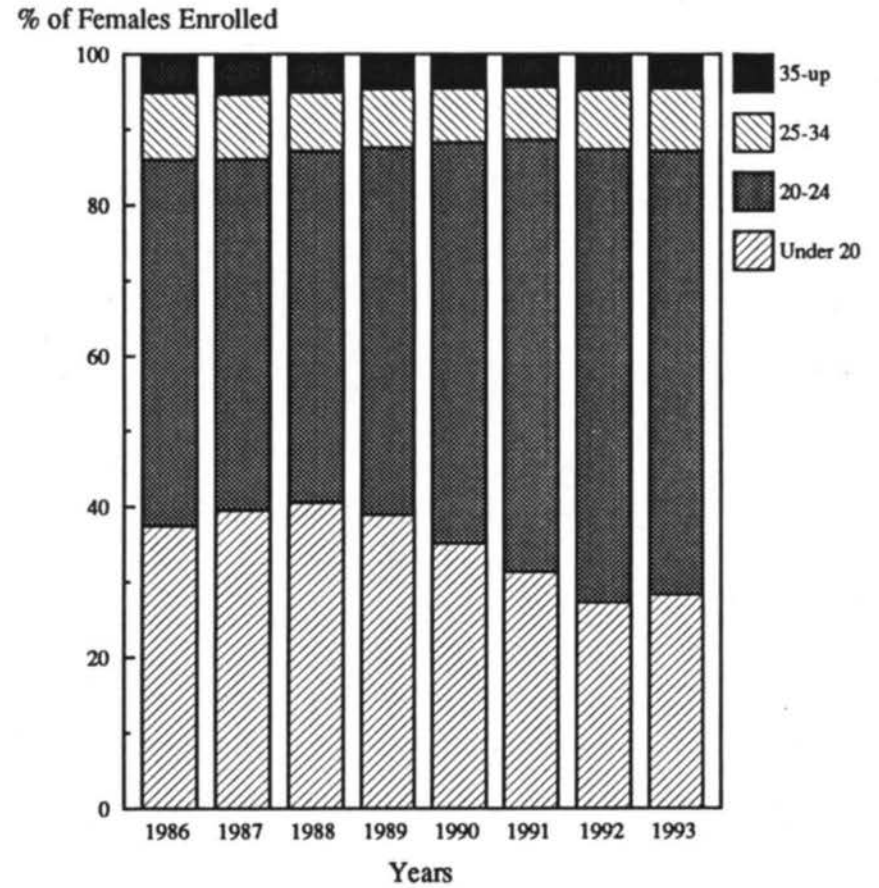

 Male 1986-1993

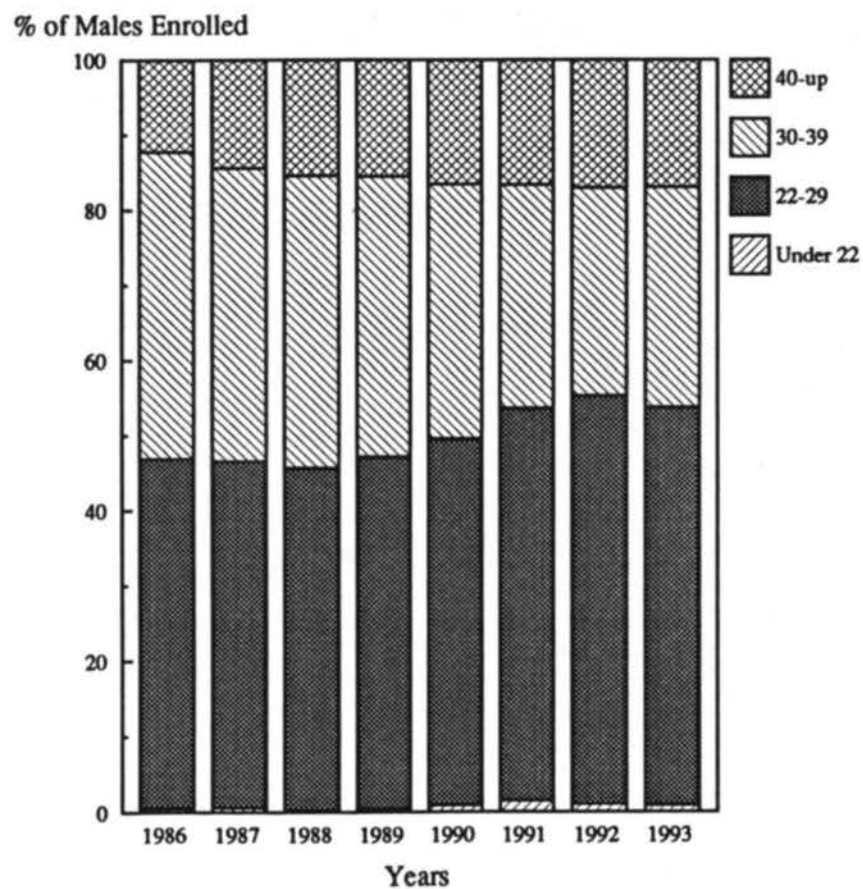

 Female 1986-1993

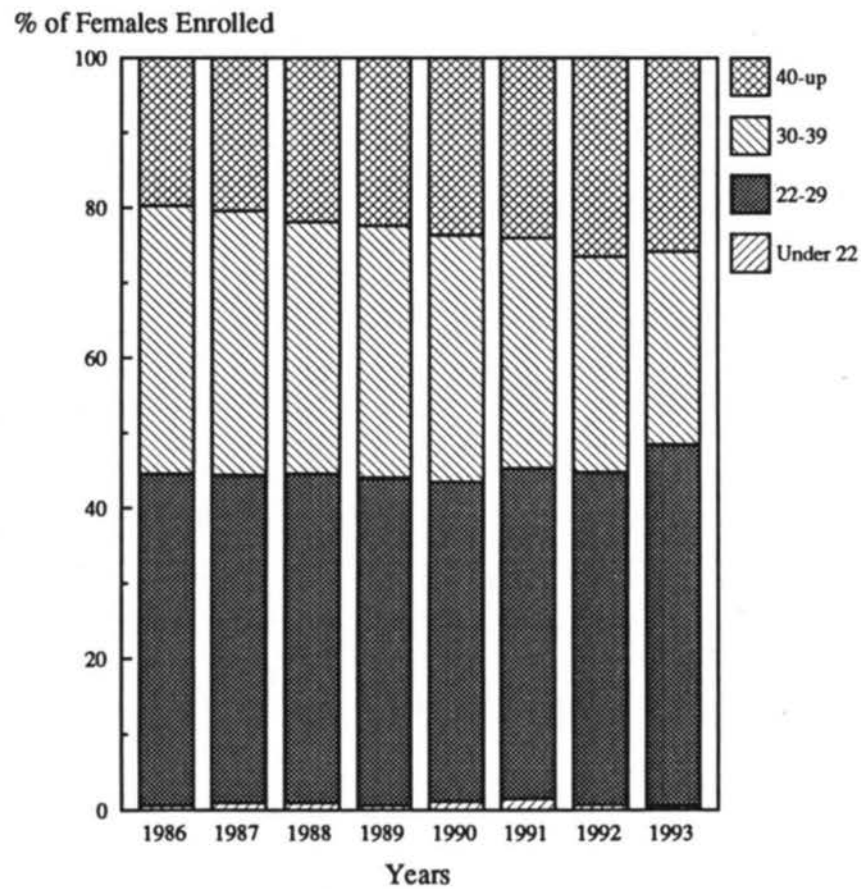

Degrees

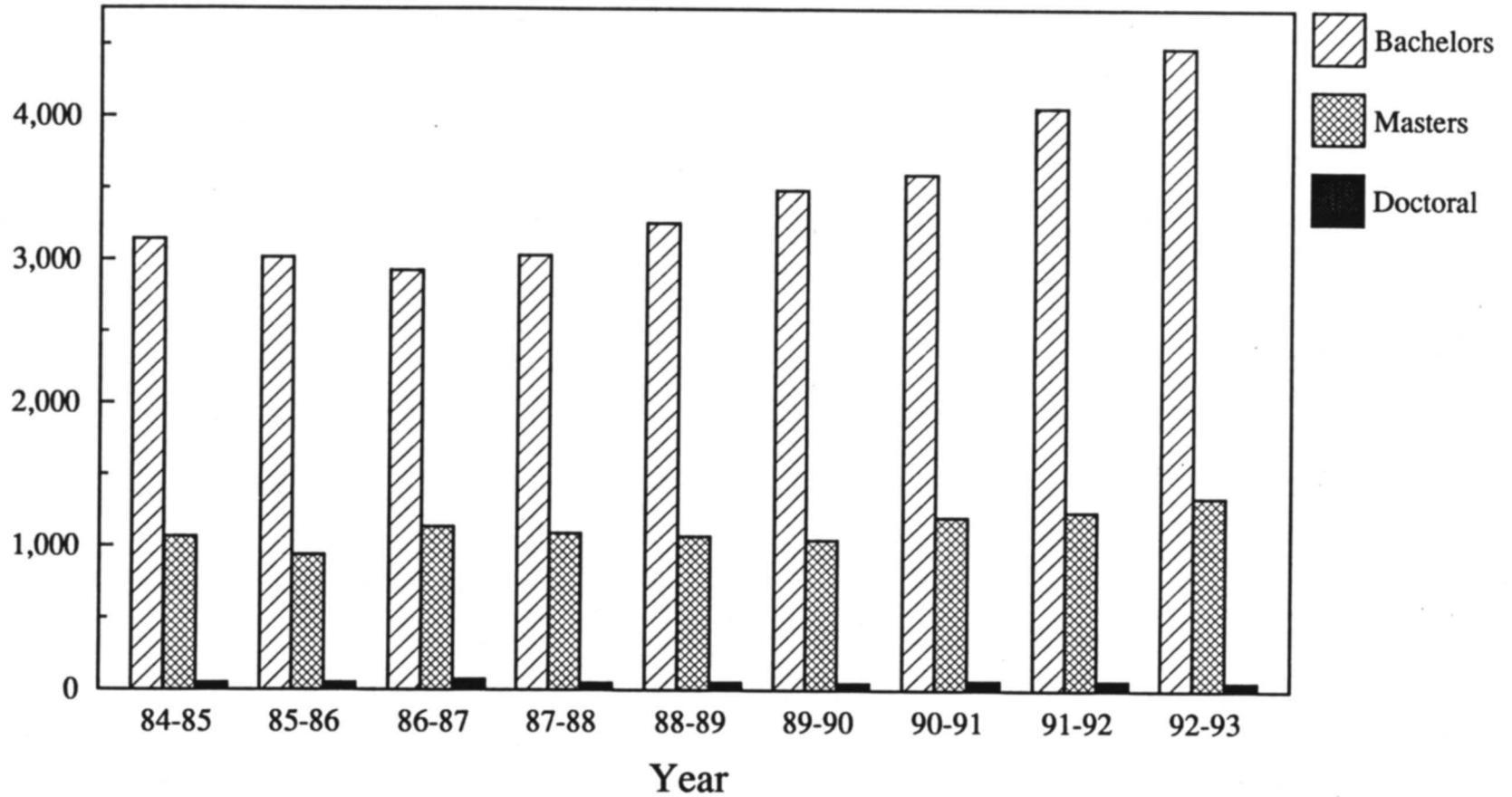

 84-85 Through 93-94

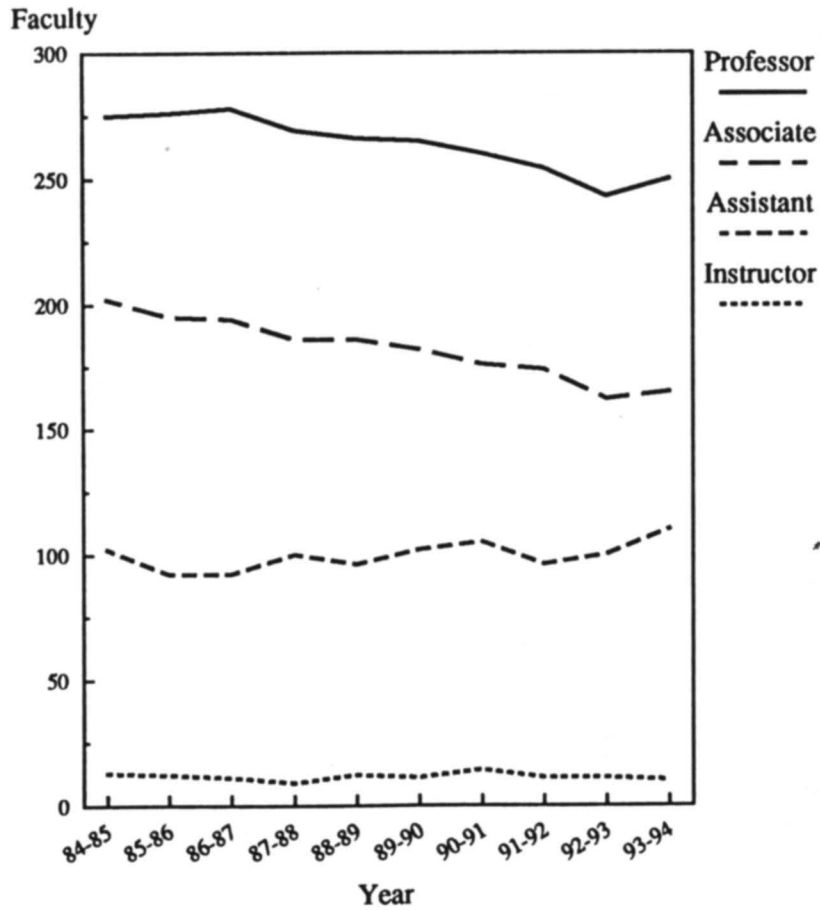

 84-85 Through 93-94

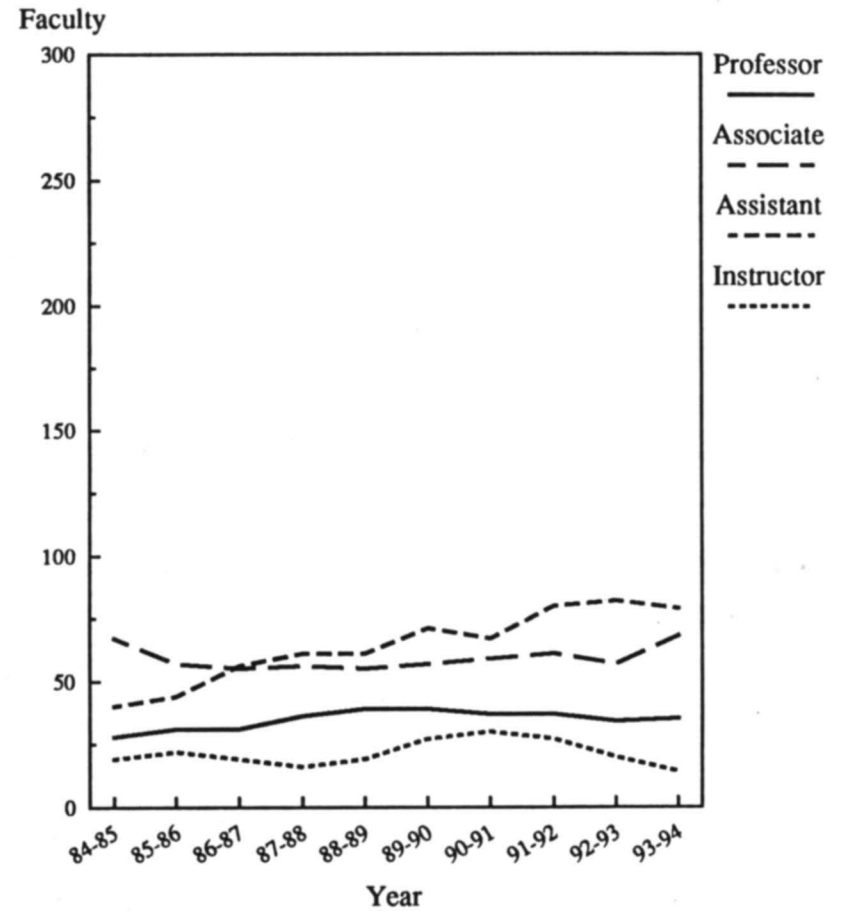

1988-89 and 1992-93

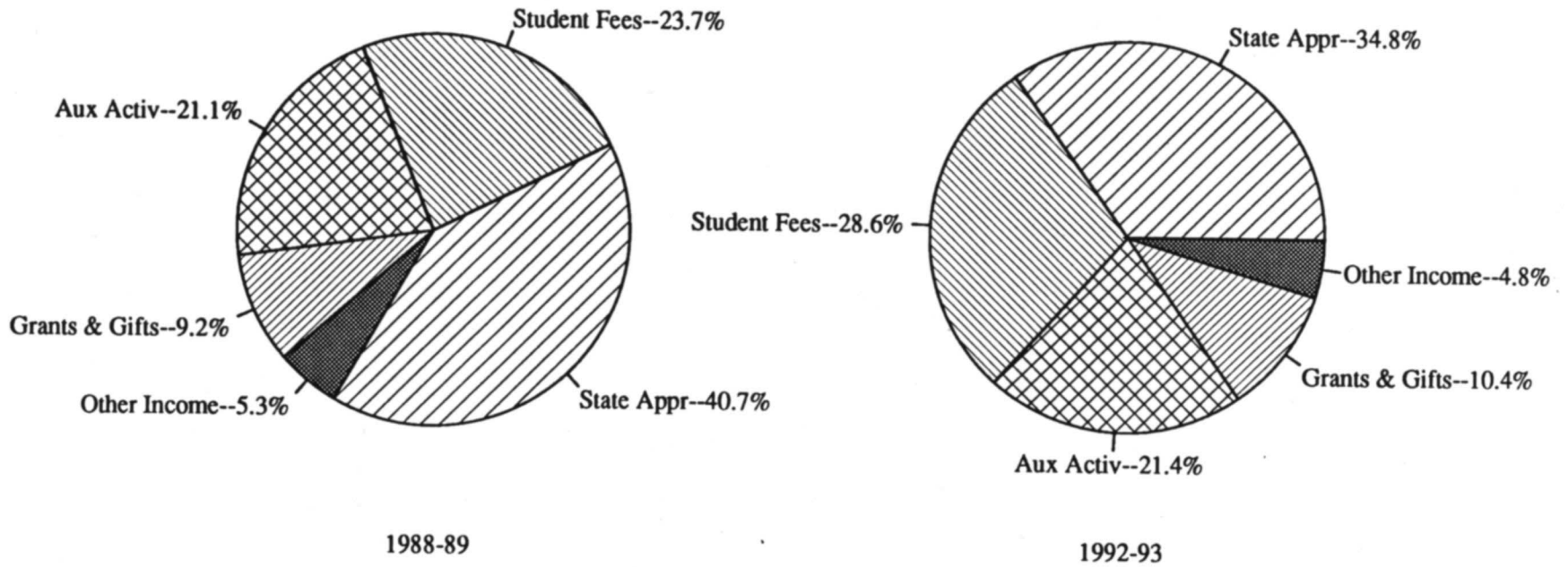


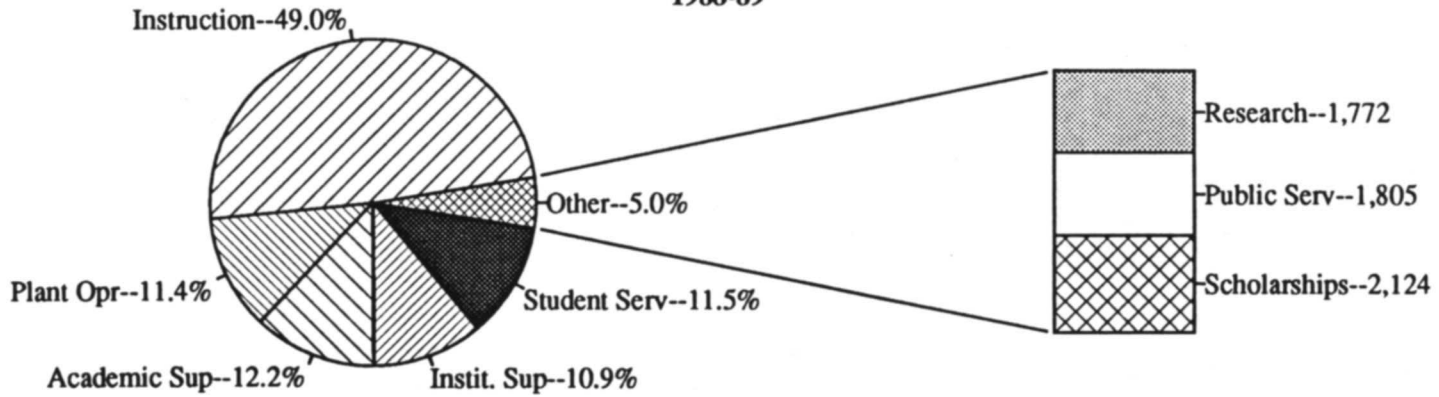
