Dr. sj Miller, a transdisciplinary award-winning teacher/writer/activist/scholar, is Deputy Director of Educational Equity Supports and Services at NYU's Metropolitan Center for Research on Equity and the Transformation of Schools. sj has published and presented widely on teaching young adult literature, anti-bullying pedagogy, challenging the gender binary, lesbian, gay, bisexual, asexual, intersex, queer and questioning topics, multimodal applications of popular culture in secondary classrooms, and cultivating socio-spatial justice dispositions with secondary preservice English teachers. Recently, sj received the 2015 Joanne Arnold Courage and Commitment Award for contributions to LGBTQ advocacy and education, and was appointed UNESCO's representative for the U.S. to develop Education for Peace and Sustainable Development in India with the Mahatma Gandhi Institute. Recent books include: Generation Bullied 2.0: Prevention and Intervention Strategies for Our Most Vulnerable Students; Educators Queering Academia: Critical Memoirs; and Teaching, Affirming, and Recognizing Trans and Gender Creative Youth: A Queer Literacy Framework.
