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### ***Workshop on Scholarship in Teaching and Learning***

On Friday, May 30, 2008 a workshop will be held at the College of Health and Human Services to discuss scholarship in teaching and learning. Panel discussions with various presenters will be held to talk about research, teaching, learning and leadership, and how to have your work published, just to name a few of the topics. Dr. David J. Malik, professor of Chemical Education and Physical Chemistry at Indiana University/Purdue University Indianapolis, Dr. Edmund Tsang, Director of The Center for Excellence in Engineering Education at Western and Dr. Betsy Aller, professor of Industrial and Manufacturing Engineering at Western, will be among the presenters.

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### ***Voluntary System of Accountability***

WMU has become the first university in Michigan and one of the first in the nation to launch a Web-based tool aimed at providing prospective students and their families a consistent and comprehensive look at critical data that will help them make institutional comparisons. The Voluntary System of Accountability (VSA) is a joint project of the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges and the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. Participating colleges and universities will post their data using a template called the VSA College Portrait. The template ensures that the data have a consistent look for all participating institutions. WMU's College Portrait went live on April 3, with a link to the information prominently placed on the WMU Home page. The University has been designated as an "Early Adopter" of

the VSA and has been authorized to add that designation to its site. Congratulations WMU!

The Assessment Institute is the nation's oldest and largest event focused exclusively on outcomes assessment in higher education. ***The process of assessment is one of comparing actual student performance with intended student outcomes.*** In other words, how well do our students achieve the objectives set for them? Assessment requires us to be clear about what students should know and be able to do---and specific about how we will measure student performance.
