One Critical Language may be used to satisfy the Liberal Arts Curriculum Foreign Language Requirement (12 semester hours). The Linguistics Department also offers an undergraduate minor in Hindi-Urdu (20 semester hours).

Prospective Critical Languages students must be enrolled for the Fall Semester (advance registration--May 20-22, June 29-July 31) and must secure a 'control card' from the secretary of the Linguistics Department, 4th floor Sprau Tower (or call 383-0064).
