She has published scholarly articles in a variety of journals and edited volumes. She is the editor of "Women on the Verge of Home" (SUNY, 2005), and author of "Miracles and Extraordinary Experience in Northern Kenya" (University of Pennsylvania Press, 2007). She has been the recipient of numerous grants and awards, including Fulbright and National Science Foundation.
