NSSE 6-year and FSSE 5-year longitudinal comparison data are now available on the "Institutional Assessment" web page at

http://www.wmich.edu/poapa/assessment/inst_assess.html. These documents also contain comparison graphs for each item at each student level (first-year and senior).
