Big Changes Coming in FY19 to NIH Academic Research Enhancement Award (AREA)/R15 Program

The NIH put out a <u>notice of changes</u> as to the way it will use the R15 activity code that includes changes to the scope of the program and eligibility changes beginning January 2019. Broadly speaking, the AREA program will support grants to undergraduate-focused institutions. The NIH also will introduce new R15 opportunities to support graduate schools of arts and sciences and health professional schools under the Research Enhancement Award Program (REAP).
