Phil joined our school when he was a sophomore. With all these activities, he has certainly made the most of the past three years.

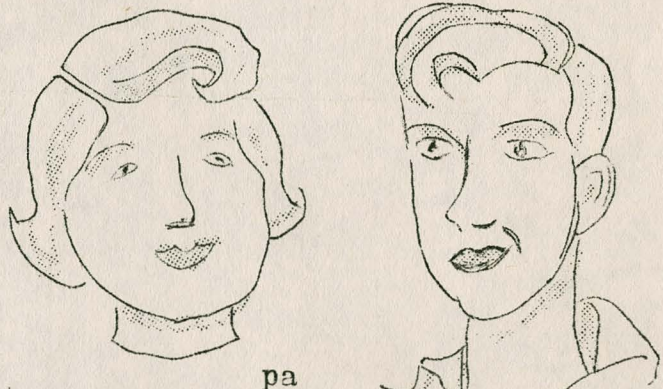
As to his future plans, Phil has recently joined the local Naval Reserve and may go into the Navy after graduation.
