“The Matter With Men: Gender Coding in the Use of Language”



David Bleich is Professor of English at the University of Rochester with a distinguished career in the areas of language and literature in society, including the history of the university and post-secondary pedagogy; the study of the use of language and the function of literary and other symbolic "written" texts in social contexts; and the history and philosophy of language research and pedagogy. He recently was honored with the 2015 CCC Outstanding Book Award for *The Materiality of Language: Gender, Politics, and the University* (Indiana UP, 2013), and is the author of many other influential works, including *Subjective Criticism* (Johns Hopkins UP, 1978), *The Double Perspective: Language, Literacy, and Social Relations* (Oxford UP, 1988), and *Know and Tell: A Pedagogy of Disclosure, Genre, and Membership* (Heinemann, 1998).
