## INTERINSTITUTIONAL STUDY AIDS STUDENTS

WMU students who wish to take a particular course, but find that it is not on the University's curriculum, may now take such a course if it is offered at either Kalamazoo College, Kalamazoo Valley Community College or Nazareth College. Thanks to Interinstitutional Study, they make take the classes at the other schools while paying only the normal tuition here. The same arrangement is open to students at each of the other Kalamazoo area colleges, according to Charles Carson, WMU director of records and newly-named interinstitutional coordinator. Students who plan to take courses at the other schools need only enroll in A-S 399 II, he noted.

## UNIVERSITY PREPARES SAUDI TEACHERS

Saudi-Arabian graduate students who intend to teach at community colleges when they return home, are getting individualized training here through a new WMU program. Community schools, which are relatively new in Saudi-Arabia, now are emerging as teacher-training schools instead of vocational and university preparation institutions, according to Dr. Owen Middleton, professor of education and professional development. Funding for the students is provided by the Saudi-Arabian government.
