DRUM CORPS CAVALCADE COMING HERE

The top five drum and bugle corps in the Midwest will take part in an official Drum Corps International competition at 4 p.m. Sunday, July 10, in Waldo Stadium here on campus. The program, presented by Miller Auditorium, will feature the Cavaliers of Park Ridge, Ill., the Guardsmen from Schaumburg, Ill., the Kilts of Racine, Wis., the Pioneers, Cedarsburg, Wis. and the Marquis from Fon Du Lac, Wis.

Tickets are \$4 for adults, \$2 for children 12 and under. All seats are general admission and on the concert side (pressbox) of the stadium. Tickets are currently on sale at the auditorium box office.

FACULTY SENATE TO DISCUSS RULES OF CONDUCT

One of the items on the agenda for the 7 p.m. Thursday, June 9, meeting of the Faculty Senate will be a report on the discussion at the recent Board of Trustees meeting concerning the proposed Rules of Conduct. It will be presented by Dr. Donald J. Brown, associate professor of chemistry and current Senate president. Also on the agenda will be a report of the committee on the University Curriculum Review Process by Dr. Helenan S. Lewis, associate professor of political science.

PLANES ADDED TO FLIGHT TRAINING FLEET

Seven newly-acquired Cessna 150 single engine airplanes have been added to the University's transportation technology department for use in its flight training program. They were acquired at no capital outlay under a new leasing arrangement just started by Cessna Aircraft Corp. According to Ronald L. Sackett, assistant professor of transportation technology, WMU is one of the first universities in the country to take advantage of Cessna's new leasing program.

"We also plan to sell our older planes and use the funds for general upgrading of the instructional operations, including the acquisition of improved flight simulation equipment for the training program at our Kalamazoo Airport facilities," he said.

CUBAN STUDY TRIP OFFERED

WMU students, faculty and staff members have the opportunity to visit the Republic of Cuba from Aug. 20-28, according to Dr. Samuel I. Clark, director of the University's Honors College. The group is limited to 25 persons on a first-come, first-served basis. The deadline for applications is July 1. Cost of the trip is estimated at \$785.

The tour will visit both modern and colonial Havana, a technical and elementary school, former prison and a citrus plantation, plus a trip to the Isle of Pines. It will concentrate on the educational, economic, political and agricultural changes which have taken place in Cuba under the Castro regime.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR DIRECTORY CHANGES

Faculty and staff members who wish to make changes in their listings in the University's telephone directory should use the following procedures:

Changes--of address, spouse or telephone should be changed on the personnel computer file by writing to Fred Hunt, 1333 Administration Building. Use the form on the back of the pay check envelope.

Deletions--of off-campus (home) information requires a written request to the Information Center, 2110 Administration Building.

The only other option is to have the spouse's name deleted, but not the home address and home telephone number. To delete a spouse's name, the employee must change his/her computer file by writing Hunt (see above).

The 1977-78 Faculty/Student/Staff Directory will include the names, title or classification, campus address and campus telephone number, PLUS the off-campus information, unless these steps are followed. This must be done each year. Last year's deletions were only for that year's directory.
