3 Markers of an Ethical Organization

- 1. Stay True to Their Mission
- 2. Act as if Outcomes Matter
- 3. Are Candid and Self-Policing

4 Step Decision Making Model

- 1. Moral Awareness: Recognition of an ethical situation
- 2. Moral Decision Making: determine which course is ethical
- 3. Moral Intent: Identify which path to take
- 4. Moral Action: following through on ethical decisions

Developed by James Rest

"Rotting from the Head Down"

- Cognitive Bias
 - Leaders with over-confidence, arrogance, and commitment to poor decisions
- Cognitive Dissonance
 - Suppression or denial of information that casts doubt on a belief or action

3 Markers of an Ethical Organization

- 1. Stay True to Their Mission
- 2. Act as if Outcomes Matter
- 3. Are Candid and Self-Policing

Government Accountability Office

- Investigated the Red Cross
- Analyzed:
 - factors affecting the organizations disaster services,
 - its coordination with the government
 - exernal oversight of the organization

American Red Cross Sunshine Act

- Drafted and presented to Congress Sept. 2015
- Allows the federal government to oversee disaster relief and obtain any information from the organization.
- An opportunity for openness
