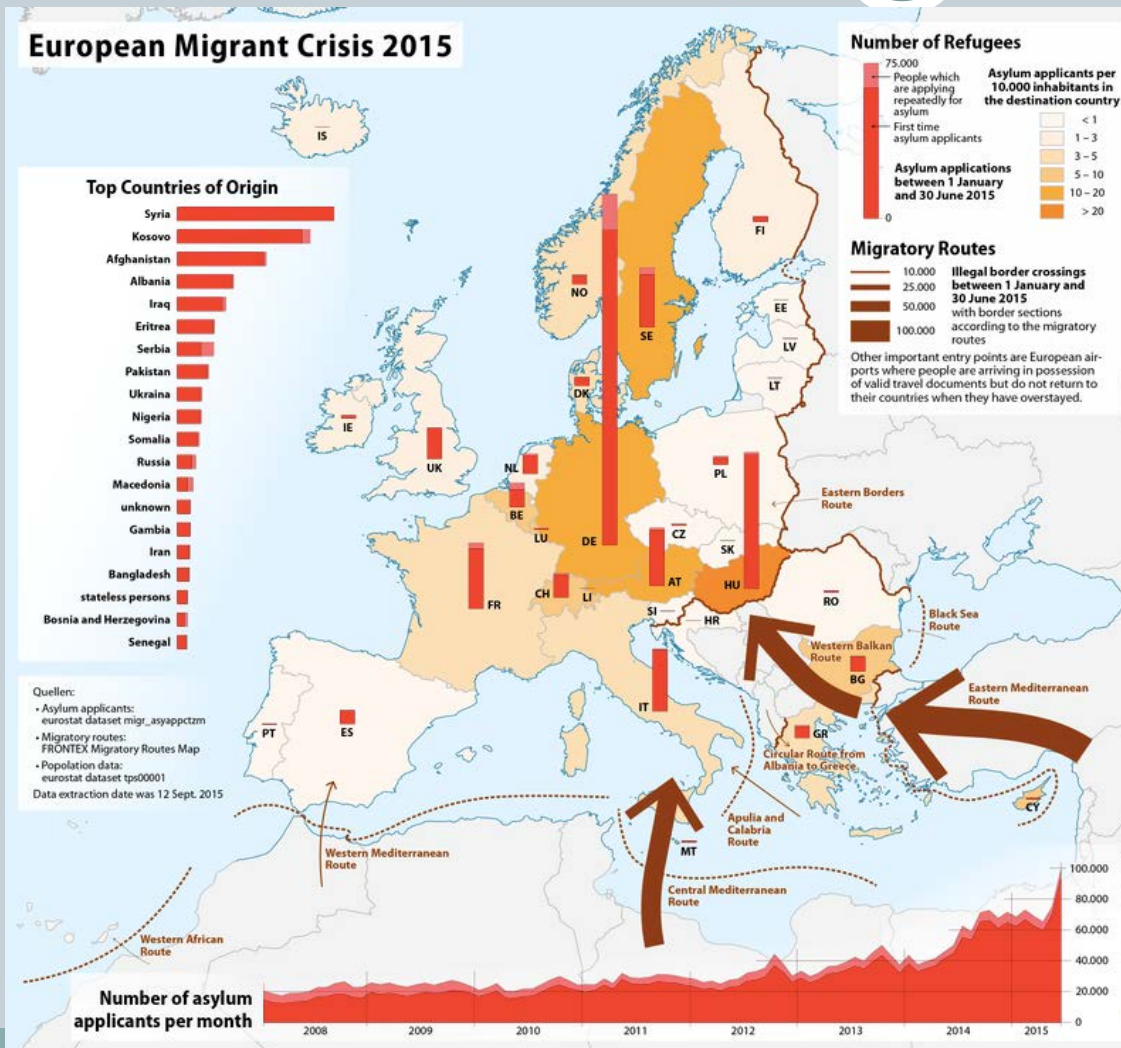

THE EUROPEAN MIGRATION CRISIS

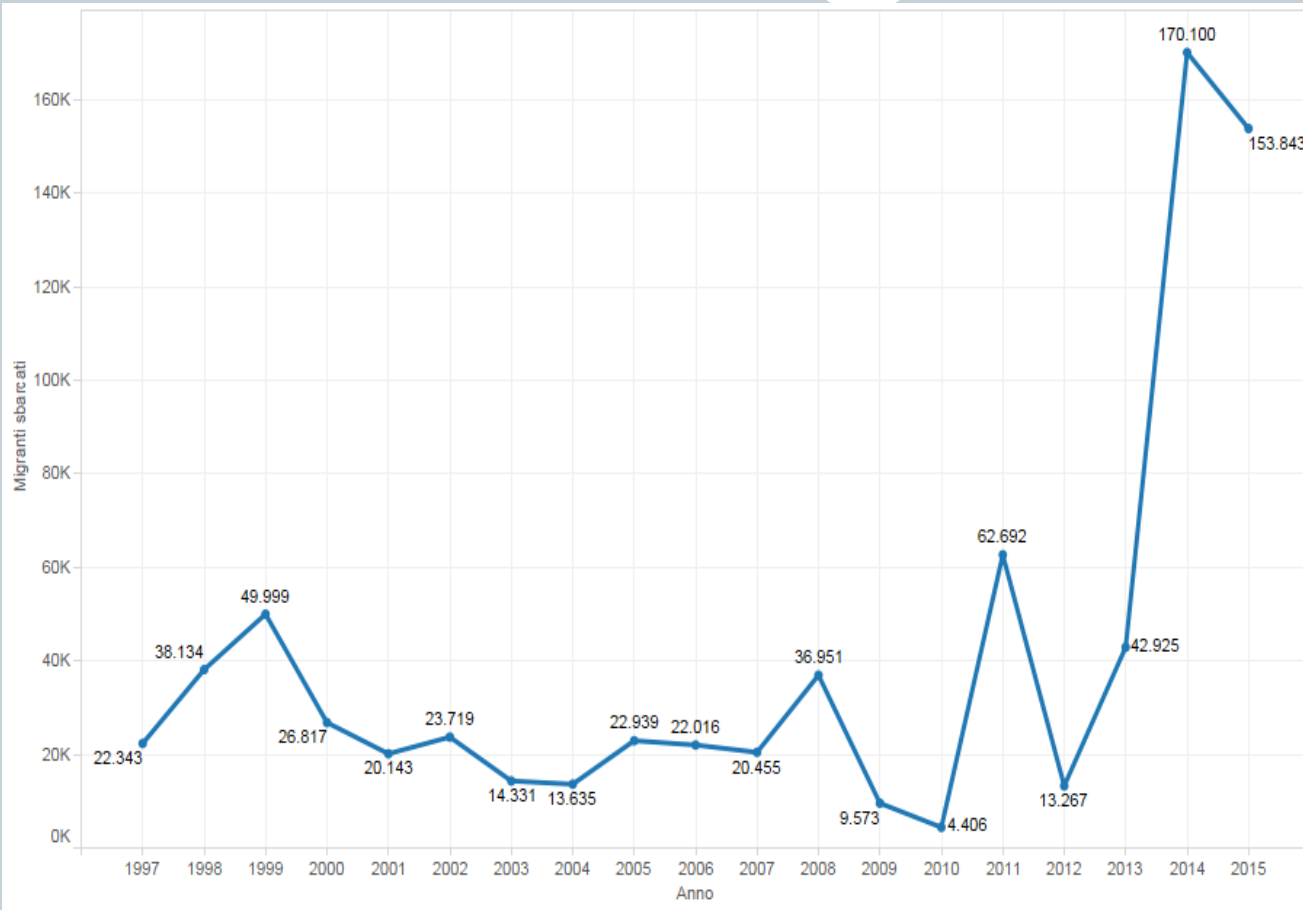


In 2015, Europe held the largest amount of misplaced people in the world at 51 percent (The UN Refugee Agency)

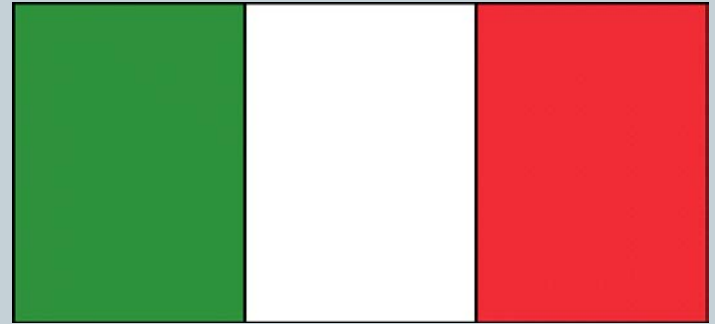
ITALY AS A REFUGEE ASYLUM
